Thursday 6:30pm May 23, 2024

The meeting was called to order at 6:30pm by Chairman Castellano who requested Legislator Ellner lead in the Pledge of Allegiance. Upon roll call Legislator Ellner and Chairman Castellano were present. Legislator Gouldman was absent.

Item #3 – Acceptance of Minutes – April 29, 2024

The minutes were accepted as submitted.

Item #4 - Correspondence/County Auditor

a. Sales Tax Report

Chairman Castellano mentioned that he spoke to Commissioner of Finance Michael Lewis about the impact of the clothing and footwear sales tax exemption.

Commissioner of Finance Michael Lewis stated the County is trending in line with its budgeted Sales Tax for 2024 of \$77.5 million. He stated there are many reasons for the fluctuation in numbers. He stated that he contacted the Department of Taxation and Finance and was informed that the Vendors file quarterly returns. He stated therefore the earliest he will be able to present the true numbers that will reflect the impact of the Sales Tax Exemption on clothing and footwear under \$110 in Putnam County will be in July.

Chairman Castellano made a motion to pre-file the necessary resolution; Seconded by Legislator Ellner. All in favor.

c. Approval/ Budgetary Amendment 24A036/ BES/ Fire Training Center (Also reviewed in Protective)

Chairman Castellano stated it was explained that there were additional costs discovered that were not accounted for. He stated fortunately additional Federal and State aid funding has been located to assist in funding this project. He stated it will be great for Putnam County and the Bureau of Emergency Services.

Chairman Castellano made a motion to pre-file the necessary resolution; Seconded by Legislator Ellner. All in favor.

d. Approval/ Budgetary Amendment 24A038/ Dept. of Public Works / Amend the 2024 CHIPS County Capital Project Budget to Equal the Adopted NYS Budget (Also reviewed in Physical)

Commissioner of Finance Michael Lewis stated Deputy Commissioner of Department of Public Works stated he accompanied the County Executive to Albany to advocate for the restoring of Putnam County's CHIPS (Consolidated Local Street and Highway Improvement Program) funding to the same amount as past years. He stated fortunately for Putnam County, they were successful.

Chairman Castellano made a motion to pre-file the necessary resolution; Seconded by Legislator Ellner. All in favor.

e. Approval/ Budgetary Amendment 24A039/ Sheriff's Youth and Community Svcs Div./ Purchase of one Project Lifesaver Bracelet for "Project Lifesaver" (Also reviewed in Protective)

Chairman Castellano stated a generous donation has been made by an attorney in Westchester, Howard Stern, who believes and supports the "Project Lifesaver" program. He stated he has donated enough funding to purchase one (1) Lifesaver Bracelet. He expressed his appreciation for this thoughtful and generous donation.

Chairman Castellano made a motion to pre-file the necessary resolution; Seconded by Legislator Ellner. All in favor.

f. Approval/ Budgetary Amendment 24A040/ Dept. of Public Works/ Guardrail Damage Compensation/ Three (3) Separate Accidents which Resulted in Guardrail Damage on County Roads (Also reviewed in Physical)

Chairman Castellano stated Risk Manager Mat Bruno is doing a great job securing funds to assist in the costs to do the repairs caused by drivers along County Roads.

Chairman Castellano made a motion to pre-file the necessary resolution; Seconded by Legislator Ellner. All in favor.

 g. Approval/ Budgetary Amendment 24A041/ Historian Office/ Outside Donation – G. Whipple via the Society for the Preservation of P.C. Antiquities & Greenways Inc. (Also reviewed in Health)

Chairman Castellano stated this is a donation for a Civil War Memorial Plaque to be placed at the Putnam County's Veteran's Memorial Park. He expressed his appreciation for this donation.

Chairman Castellano made a motion to pre-file the necessary resolution; Seconded by Legislator Ellner. All in favor.

h. Approval/ Budgetary Amendment 24A042/ Sheriff's Dept./ NYS Stop-DWI Foundation Inc. Reimbursement (Also reviewed in Protective)

Chairman Castellano made a motion to pre-file the necessary resolution; Seconded by Legislator Ellner. All in favor.

i. Approval/ Budgetary Amendment 24A044/ Finance Dept./ ARPA Administrative Costs

Commissioner of Finance Lewis stated the County's ARPA consultant has informed the County that the U.S. Treasury guidelines allow up to 10% of total ARPA allocations to go towards administrative costs. He stated from now until the end of this year the focus is to make sure that everyone is in compliance with the ARPA guidelines to meet the deadline of December 31, 2024. He stated he and the Administration believe this to be appropriate to keep the process moving forward.

Chairman Castellano made a motion to pre-file the necessary resolution; Seconded by Legislator Ellner. All in favor.

 j. Approval/ Budgetary Amendment 24A045/ Sheriff's Dept./ Use of T-Commission Funds for Laptops for Correctional Facility (Also reviewed in Protective)

Legislator Crowley questioned why these computers were not budgeted for and how often are new computers purchased for use by the inmates.

Commissioner of Finance Lewis stated the use of the T Commission funds results in no impact to the taxpayers, this is an approved use of these funds.

Sheriff McConville stated computers are purchased for the inmates as a computer no longer works, one is purchased to replace one that no longer works.

Chairman Castellano made a motion to pre-file the necessary resolution; Seconded by Legislator Ellner. All in favor.

k. Approval/ Budgetary Amendment 24A046/ Sheriff's Dept./ Use of T-Commission Funds for Two (2) Network Video Recorders (NVRs) (Also reviewed in Protective)

Chairman Castellano made a motion to pre-file the necessary resolution; Seconded by Legislator Ellner. All in favor.

Item #6 – Approval/ Budgetary Transfer 24T090/ District Attorney/ Compensation for the District Attorneys in New York State (Also Reviewed in Personnel)

Commissioner of Finance Mike Lewis addressed the inquiries submitted to him regarding what is the calculation that is used to arrive at the increase amount of the District Attorney's salary. He stated the salary and increases for the County District Attorneys throughout New York State are set by the State and are based on the salary of the County Court Judge.

Chairman Castellano stated the County Court Judge and the District Attorney have to have the same salary.

Chairman Castellano made a motion to pre-file the necessary resolution; Seconded by Legislator Ellner. All in favor.

Item #7 – Approval/ Budgetary Transfer – 24T092/ Dept. of Public Works/ Close Out Various Capital Projects and Transfer to the Capital Projects Reserve for Future Projects (Also reviewed in Physical)

Chairman Castellano made a motion to pre-file the necessary resolution; Seconded by Legislator Ellner. All in favor.

Item #8 – Approval/ Fund Transfer 24T120/ IT/GIS/ Permanent Status of an IT Systems Specialist (Also Reviewed in Personnel)

Chairman Castellano made a motion to pre-file the necessary resolution; Seconded by Legislator Ellner. All in favor.

Item #9 – Approval/ Fund Transfer 24T127/ IT/GIS/ Establish a GIS Tech part-time position and assist in funding GIS Aid full-time position (Also Reviewed in Personnel)

Chairman Castellano made a motion to pre-file the necessary resolution; Seconded by Legislator Ellner. All in favor.

Item #11 - Other Business

a. Approval/ Discussion/ Bureau of Emergency Svcs./ Creation of Rescue Task Force (Moved from Protective)

Chairman Castellano made a motion to waive the rules and accept the other business; Seconded by Legislator Ellner. All in favor.

Legislator Nacerino explained that this was discussed in Protective Services, and there was a resolution that was submitted by Commissioner Lipton, which needs some revisions and updating before the Legislature is ready to consider it. She stated this is a process for consideration, which distinguishes it very differently from the Emergency Response Team, which was never approved by the Legislature. She spoke to the function and mission of this proposed Rescue Task Force. She stated she is very much in support of this endeavor. She stated there were comments made that there was money already encumbered for this task force and that is not correct.

Commissioner of Finance Mike Lewis stated if this task force will involve volunteers, then it will be deferred to Risk Manager Mat Bruno. He listed some questions that he has that would need to be answered by Commissioner of Bureau of Emergency Services Lipton.

Legislator Nacerino stated that Commissioner Lipton is out of Town. She stated she acknowledges this is very vague at this point. She stated she is not even clear on who wrote the resolution.

First Deputy County Attorney John Cherico stated there were questions sent to the County Attorney's office from Chair of Audit Castellano: 1. Was the resolution reviewed and approved by the County Law Department? 2. Is a Municipal Agreement needed to form the Rescue Task Force proposed by Commissioner Lipton? 3. Legislator Ellner asked if events have to take place in a certain sequential fashion in the facilitation and creation of this proposed Task Force. He stated the Law Department did review the resolution. He stated Deputy County Attorney Ravo will address the questions.

Deputy County Attorney Dan Ravo stated regarding the procedures required to form this type of a team they are found in the General Municipal Law (GML) Section 209-bb. He stated the GML does permit the Legislature to form this specialized team. He stated outside of creating a resolution, subsequent to a public hearing, there are no other parameters for the Legislature to create this team. He stated per his review of the State Law and Putnam County Code there is no requirement for a Intermunicipal Agreement. He stated there is no procedure in the creation of this Task Force. He stated once the Task Force is created the GML permits the municipalities that are providing the volunteers to extend their insurance to include those members who are part of the specialized team. He stated that does not require the Legislature in the resolution to include that, that is the responsibility of the municipality providing the volunteers.

Legislator Ellner questioned if the municipalities involved, would they have to list the County as an additional insurer on their policy.

Risk Manager Mat Bruno stated the County would request that on the Certificate of Insurance of the volunteer's municipality that it would include the County as an additional insurer for protective measures. He stated most volunteers will be covered under GML 207A the Firefighter equivalent to Workers Compensation. He stated police officers or Sheriff's officers would be covered under 207C. He continued to speak to the potential challenges of that request of the municipalities, which would be addressed appropriately.

Legislative Counsel Rob Firriolo stated this particular team would be created under a pretty unique provision of a section of the municipal law that includes a provision that requires the members of the team have to indemnify and hold harmless the County (municipality) that uses them, as long as they are under contract. He stated if Town and County were to contract with this team for services then the members of that team would be required to indemnify and hold harmless. He stated while insurance is great, and the members of the team are going to want insurance, he would defer to the Risk Manager for confirmation, but he believes from the County's Risk Management perspective, as long as the contract is in place it leaves the County off the hook.

Risk Manager Mat Bruno stated a Hold Harmless would be appropriate and presented. He stated it would be like a double protection.

Legislative Counsel Rob Firriolo stated it would not just be the need for a written Hold Harmless would be required, it is statutory as long as the contract is in place. He stated in terms of sequence after the team is in place and formed, he believes it would behoove the County and municipalities using this to enter into these written contracts with the team so they can revoke that liability protection.

Risk Manager Mat Bruno stated that does make sense.

Legislator Nacerino requested this matter be tabled back to the Protective Services Committee. She stated that will allow Commissioner Lipton to provide his input and work with the Law Department to amend the proposed resolution. She stated she is not sure that the resolution was reviewed by the Law Department.

First Deputy County Attorney John Cherico stated the resolution was reviewed by the Law Department, but based on the concerns expressed this evening he concurred that Commissioner Lipton should work with the Law Department further on this matter.

Legislator Crowley thanked Legislator Nacerino for the recommendation to table this item for further review. She stated she spoke to the grant and available funding that would be used. She stated the County still owes two (2) other entities money from this grant. She stated before money is taken from this grant to support the creation of this new team, she would like Carmel and Kent to be paid.

Commissioner of Finance Mike Lewis stated Carmel and Kent were paid through December 31, 2023.

Legislator Crowley stated they were not paid for the first quarter of 2024.

Commissioner of Finance Mike Lewis stated the team was dissolved in December 2023, therefore the County does not owe them money for the first quarter of 2024.

Legislator Crowley stated she can provide a copy of a document that shows money is owed for the first quarter 2024.

Sheriff McConville stated there are two (2) different grants being discussed. He stated the grant for the Rescue Task Forces comes from a grant in the Bureau of Emergency Services. He stated the money utilized for the previously constructed Emergency Response Team is a different grant. He stated there are two different funding sources. He stated Commissioner Lewis stated Carmel was paid for the month of December is 2023. He stated per the County Executive's memorandum of December 4, 2023, the ERT was disbanded. He stated there are no funds to reimburse any of the other agencies.

Legislator Ellner requested the members of the County Law Department speak to the sequence of events that need to take place and in what order, to form the Rescue Task Force.

Deputy County Attorney Dan Ravo stated he would recommend the Rescue Task Force be created, and then reach out to the municipalities. He stated they could then use the fully approved County Resolution as the basis of their resolutions. He stated those municipalities who are willing to extend their insurance, so long as the Risk Department approves, then the County could enter into agreements with the municipalities as the County sees appropriate.

Legislator Ellner questioned if the resolution prepared by the Law Department for the Legislature to consider for approval could include verbiage that would state, "deployment of the Rescue Task Force would not take place until such time all of the other items have been satisfied".

Deputy County Attorney Dan Ravo stated yes that could be done.

Legislator Nacerino stated this is the first step in the process, and until the Legislature approves of it, we cannot move forward with engaging with the other towns to get this up and running. She stated that if there are any moneys to be expended, she believed that would come before the Legislature as well. She stated that this just enables us by creation to move forward.

Chairman Castellano stated there were comments made at Protective referencing "zones", do we have any information on those details.

Legislator Nacerino stated she is not knowledgeable enough to speak to that. She stated that Commissioner of Bureau of Emergency Services Robert Lipton will provide that information at the next Protective Services meeting.

Legislative Counsel Firriolo questioned the Law Department Members regarding the need for a "Public Hearing". He stated the wording in 209-BB is unusual in how it speaks to the "Public Hearing". He stated that it was mentioned that there needs to be a "Public Hearing" before the resolution. He stated typically the Legislature does not hold the "Public Hearing" before passing a resolution unless it is specifically worded that way, such as with Agricultural District inclusion approvals and budget hearings. He stated typically in the case of a local law, the resolution is first passed by the Legislature and then the County Executive holds a "Public Hearing" before he signs it. He stated he is mentioning this because he believes it would be useful for the Law Department to notify the Legislature their view whether a "Public Hearing" needs to be held before the consideration/approval of the resolution or after the Legislature assumably passes it, when in that case it will be the County Executive who would hold the "Public Hearing".

Deputy County Attorney Dan Ravo stated he will look into that and provide clarification to the Legislature and Legislative Counsel Firriolo.

Chairman Castellano made a motion to Table the Creation of Rescue Task Force back to the Protective Services Committee; Seconded by Legislator Ellner. All in favor.

 Approval/ Budgetary Amendment 24A047/ Dept. of Public Works/ Amend Capital Projects: Putnam County Sheriff's Office (PCSO) Correction Facility Boiler Replacement and PCSO Correctional Facility Gate Improvements (County ARPA)

Chairman Castellano made a motion to Waive the Rules and Accept the Other Business; Seconded by Legislator Ellner. All in favor.

Commissioner of Finance Michael Lewis stated he met with DPW Commissioner Feighery and Deputy Commission Bellucci who reported that additional funds are required to replace the PCSO Correction Facilities Boiler and Improve the PCSO Correctional Facility Gate. He stated the original budget amounts were not enough. He spoke about the transfer of funds.

Chairman Castellano questioned why the transfer of \$125,000 is coming from the Sheriff's Office School Safety ARPA budget line. He questioned is that an indication that it is no longer needed.

Commissioner of Finance Lewis stated he will defer to the Sheriff to address that but would like to state the Sheriff's Office has been reaching out to the schools and unfortunately there have been no responses. He stated it is a small amount of the \$2

million. He has stated the County needs to demonstrate the use of the ARPA funds, and this is an appropriate use of the funding.

Sheriff McConville stated he is working with Commissioner of Finance Lewis and Purchasing Director Tully to identify technology-based programs that will be utilized for school safety. He continued to speak to some of the plans they have to spend the ARPA – School Safety funds on. He concluded that he would continue to work closely with the Commissioner of Finance during this process.

Legislator Crowley stated she sent a memo to Chair of Protective Legislator Nacerino requesting an update on the Sheriff's ARPA School Safety funds be an agenda item in June.

Legislator Nacerino responded by stating the Sheriff was speaking to that topic right now and it is being discussed.

Legislator Crowley stated she would like to hear a little bit more about what the rest of the \$2 million dollars are allocated for.

Chairman Castellano stated he wanted to return to the discussion of this agenda item. He confirmed there was no further discussion.

Chairman Castellano made a motion to pre-file the necessary resolution; Seconded by Legislator Ellner. All in favor.

Item #12 – Adjournment

There being no further business at 7:25pm, Chairman Castellano made a motion to adjourn; Seconded by Legislator Ellner. All in favor.

Commissioner Lewis stated it is the County's understanding that the ERT (Emergency Response Team) was disbanded via the County Attorney's letter. He stated the County paid everything through December 31, 2023.

Legislator Jonke stated if there are any payments outstanding, he would like to see a bill.

Legislator Ellner stated he believes from the County's perspective, the ERT was disbanded and from the perspective of Kent and Carmel, the Sheriff's Department removed themselves from the ERT, but it continues to exist.

Legislator Jonke stated he does not believe the ERT can continue to exist without the County being part of it because the Sheriff's Department is the only law enforcement agency with jurisdiction in each town in the County. He stated the ERT was never properly created.

Legislator Crowley stated she would provide the bill to the Legislature. She agreed with Legislator Ellner's statement regarding the Sheriff's Department removing themselves from the ERT. She stated in the past several years the County has applied for the SHSP (State Homeland Security Program) grant. She stated in looking at the grant, it is for the three (3) agencies together. She questioned Risk Management and the Law Department if anything needs to be amended with the State because the grant has changed. She questioned if the County owes money or equipment to the State because the three (3) municipalities are no longer operating under the ERT together.

Legislator Jonke stated he would expect notification from the State if that were the case.

Legislator Nacerino stated at the Protective Services Committee Meeting Sheriff McConville made it perfectly clear that there is no money owed. She stated also, the grant is in the name of the County of Putnam Sheriff's Department; it is not commingled with Carmel and Kent.

Legislator Ellner stated according to Captain James Schepperly, the disbandment of the ERT took place around December 10, 2023 and all bills through December 31, 2023 should be paid. He stated he would like to note that the grant for 2024 appears to also cover 2023.

Legislator Crowley stated the grant was written under the scope of the County as it is the only way it could be written; the local municipalities cannot apply themselves. She stated the police departments in the town receive 35% of the grant award, with budgetary lines attributed to the different purposes such as overtime. She stated changes made to the ERT impact the grant as there are specific uses for the funding. She stated the State has not been made aware of any changes made to the ERT. She stated she believes the grant should be amended.

Legislator Nacerino stated she believes Commissioner of Finance Lewis, Sheriff McConville, and Captain Schepperly would be well aware of the importance of notifying the State; she would be surprised if that was not the case.

Chairman Castellano questioned how much grant money is left in the account.

Commissioner Lewis stated he does not have that information in front of him.

Chairman Castellano stated right now, the Committee is considering a bill for the Sheriff's Department in the amount of \$15,709 that needs to be paid. He stated there is more to look into in regard to the grant. He stated Legislator Crowley raised some good questions that will need to be answered, however they are separate from what is in front of the Committee this evening.

The Administration has worked closely with the Sheriff's Department that was granted ARPA funds pursuant to Resolution #135 of 2022 by the Legislature to ensure compliance with applicable rules and regulations set forth by the US Treasury. This has included efforts from our own internal ARPA Committee, as well as review and assistance by the County's outside ARPA consultant. As a result of these reviews, it has come to our attention that all the Sheriff's capital projects that were approved as part of the 2024 Capital Plan are also eligible under Expenditure Category 6.1 – Provision of Government Services (see attached). 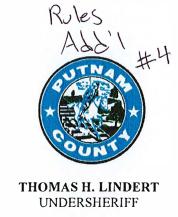

Dear County Executive Byrne,

The purpose of this letter is to provide you with an update regarding the \$2 Million appropriation and allocation of ARPA funding to the Sheriff's Office. I am requesting a funding source change that I believe most efficiently uses the funding, meets my Office's goals, and will be beneficial for the County.

The Sheriff's Office was given oversight of \$2 Million of the County's ARPA funding for School Safety – Infrastructure Upgrades pursuant to Resolution #135 of 2022. The initial intent of the ARPA funding was to provide an opportunity for my Office to work collaboratively with the County's schools to identify and fund various school safety and infrastructure improvements. However, the full development and completion of the school projects currently contemplated will not likely meet the ARPA compliance deadlines because of delayed responses from vendors and manufacturers.

We have a revised plan for how we would like to allocate the entire \$2 Million and will need your cooperation to do so. In the 2024 Capital Budget, the Legislature authorized three projects that are critically important to the Putnam County Sheriff's Office and Correctional Facility: Boiler replacements -\$700,000; Perimeter Security Improvements- \$125,000; and Life Safety Systems Modernization -\$850,000. Attached is a brief explanation of each project as originally presented for consideration. I have discussed the timing of these Capital Projects with DPW, Purchasing, and Finance and they are on schedule to be completed within the timeline required for ARPA compliance.

Therefore, I am asking that \$1 Million of ARPA funding earmarked for School Safety and Infrastructure projects be equally exchanged with the Sheriff's Office facility Capital Projects general fund sources. We will be able to continue to explore the originally planned school safety projects, but without the ARPA timing constraints. Finally, the remaining \$1 Million in ARPA funds can then be used to pursue additional projects that support our County's school children.

Thank you for your anticipated support in this matter.

The Administration has worked closely with all the Towns and Villages granted ARPA funds pursuant to Resolutions #133 of 2022 by the Legislature to ensure compliance with applicable rules and regulations for use of ARPA funding by the County's subrecipients. This has included efforts from our own internal ARPA Committee, as well as review and assistance by the County's outside ARPA consultant. As a result of these reviews, it has come to our attention that the Town of Philipstown's costs associated with the Garrison Landing Water District may not be in compliance with standards set forth by the US Treasury. It is our understanding that this project for drinking water was essential for Philipstown residents. However, despite valiant efforts from both the County and the Town, the expenses would likely not be eligible for ARPA and/or not be in compliance with rules for procurement using ARPA funds.

As such, the Administration is seeking to reallocate the \$369,670 of APRA funds originally allocated to the Town of Philipstown pursuant to Resolution #133 of 2022 to a County ARPA-eligible project to ensure ARPA compliance and retention of ARPA dollars. More specifically, the County intends to expend the funds on an ARPA-eligible DPW project located in the Town of Philipstown.

Further, on behalf of the Town of Philipstown, the Administration is requesting approval to provide \$184,835 in funds from the General Fund, which was originally allocated to County capital projects, to the Town of Philipstown to support the Town in this much-needed project and its related costs.

It is the Administration's belief that this amount assists the Town in accordance with the intent contemplated by Resolution #133 of 2022, helping the Town with an essential need, while also recognizing other, County towns and villages' efforts to comply with the ARPA requirements.

The Putnam County District Attorney's Office is requesting salary increases for two budget lines as follows:

First, salary line 116510115 is currently a part-time Assistant District Attorney position with a salary of \$65,294. In the 2024 budget, \$19,706, was earmarked to be used if and when this position became vacant (see line 116510999) to transition this to a full-time position at an entry level Assistant District Attorney salary of \$85,000. Based upon the needs of the office that have been previously discussed and will further be outlined at the legislative meeting, the District Attorney is requesting an additional \$45,000 for salary line 116510115, bringing the salary to \$130,000, with the intent to hire an experienced full-time Appellate Attorney to fill the vacant position.

Second, the Personnel Department recently conducted a job analysis review of line 116510105 which is currently a full-time Assistant District Attorney position within our department. The review was initiated on May 28, 2024, and after all information was considered, the Personnel Department concluded that the position should be properly titled "Asisstant District Attorney – Bureau Chief." This change in classification is accompanied by a request for a salary increase of \$22,112, increasing the current salary of \$107,888 to \$130,000.

The salary increases and the change in classification will be covered by the Discovery Grant funds in 10115400 430890. The District Attorney is requesting that the re-classification for position 116510105 take place immediately and the salary increase be retroactive to January 1, 2024. The salary increase for the newly-created full-time Appellate Attorney position will take effect upon the hiring of a qualified candidate.

Please refer this request to the Personnel committee for their review. A budgetary transfer will be provided by the Finance Department under separate cover.

Thank you for your consideration of this request. The District Attorney intends to address these requests at the personnel committee meeting scheduled for July 9, 2024, and is open to any questions at any time.

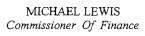

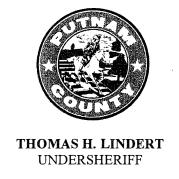

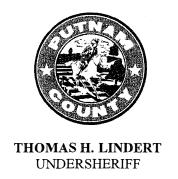

The Putnam County Department of Public Works is requesting the consideration of the repurposing of the Farmers Mills Road (8757.67) Bridge Project funds to the Fair St.

Reconstruction Project (8756.09). Currently, and as indicated on the most recent TIP, the Farmers Mills Rd. Project includes \$551,000 for DETLDES/PRELDES/ROWINCD obligating this FFY, \$138,000 for ROWACQU obligating in FFY 2025 and \$4.793M for CONST/CONINSP obligating in FFY 2026. After thorough evaluation and consideration of alternative immediate needs, the Department feels as if the Farmers Mills Rd. Bridge is not of immediate nor short term concern. The bridge currently lacks any significant visible structural deficiencies and has not been flagged by NYSDOT Inspectors as of now.

The Fair St. Reconstruction Project is scheduled to be let this Spring/Summer with \$24.705M obligated for CONST & CONINSP this FFY. Due to the industry-wide construction market trend increases since the last estimate and programming of funds, the Department anticipates a potential shortfall upon opening of bids. To avoid any delays associated with the potential for a funding shortfall and subsequent impacts to the project schedule, we feel as if the Farmers Mills funds would be better utilized if they were to be repurposed to the Fair St. Reconstruction Project.

We respectfully request your consideration for the reappropriation of funds as outlined above.

I. INTRODUCTION

The New York State Division of Criminal Justice Services (DCJS) seeks applications from law enforcement agencies to fund law enforcement technologies (LETECH) and applicable software/equipment – such as license plate readers, mobile and fixed surveillance cameras, unmanned aerial vehicles, gunshot detection devices, smart equipment for patrol vehicles and officers, technology or software and other kinds of public safety equipment – to help keep New Yorkers and our law enforcement partners safe. Approximately (fifty million dollars) \$50,000,000 is expected to be available to fund LETECH and applicable equipment/ software for local law enforcement agencies outside of New York City.

Law enforcement technology is intended to help local law enforcement agencies prevent and solve crimes, particularly violent crimes by firearms and crimes of community concern (e.g., motor vehicle thefts). As well as serve as an integrated part of an agency's problem-solving and community-engagement strategy, helping to increase public trust and communication.

DCJS enhances public safety by providing resources and services that inform decision making and improve the quality of the criminal justice system. DCJS is a multi-function criminal justice support agency with a variety of responsibilities, including collection and analysis of statewide crime data; operation of the DNA databank and criminal fingerprint files; administration of federal and state criminal justice funds; identifying and funding programs that reduce crime, recidivism, and victimization. Additionally, DCJS administers the state's Sex Offender Registry. DCJS conducts research on critical criminal justice issues and provides training, legal guidance and regulation to the State's law enforcement, community corrections and prosecutorial communities.

DCJS is committed to providing programs that improve the effectiveness of New York's criminal justice system. Applications will be selected for funding consistent with the best interest of the state.

II. LAW ENFORCEMENT TECHNOLOGY PROGRAM INFORMATION

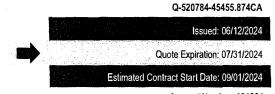

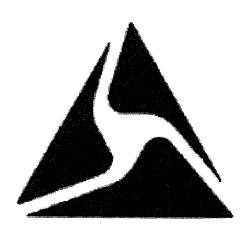

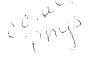

A classification form was submitted to Personnel and based upon the work duties performed, the new title has been classified as Principal Office Assistant.

Employee will transition from a Grade 11; Step 4 + 2 longevities to a Grade 12; Step 4 + 2 longevities. Under 2023 CSEA pay rates, the upgrade will result in an increased pay rate of \$2,614. By repurposing funds in the 2024 budget originally booked under 51094 for the incumbent to continue in a part time manner, this upgrade will have \$0 fiscal impact for 2024 (10106000 & 10116000).

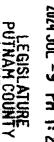
